


STUDENTS

Students were given a talk by a staff member about the library, taking out books, where to locate books etc. This link with the community is fantastic for students.










Rolling First Year Reading Class
















TY students paired reading with First Year students.

Senior students celebrating Poetry Day Ireland at the beginning of May. Students picked and read their favourite poems and all received a Pocket Poem from Poetry Ireland.









Students from different years taking part in the Tipperary ETB Public Speaking Competition.










Reading material is left in each classroom should students forget to bring their novels.










Teacher Book Swap

Teachers who took part in the book swap having a meeting to discuss and pass on their ideas & books.





Competition – World Book Day






A display was left in reception and parents could drop in, take a book and leave a book as it suited them. We gathered a huge amount of books for the Book Swap.


Pictured here are senior students; organising books, brought in by parents, for the book swap! The Book Swap was a wonderful success.

St. Ailbe's have made a number of links with the community to promote a love of reading.


Links with the community:


- Links were made throughout the community to promote reading.
